QUEENSFERRY ACTIVE TRAVEL PROJECTS

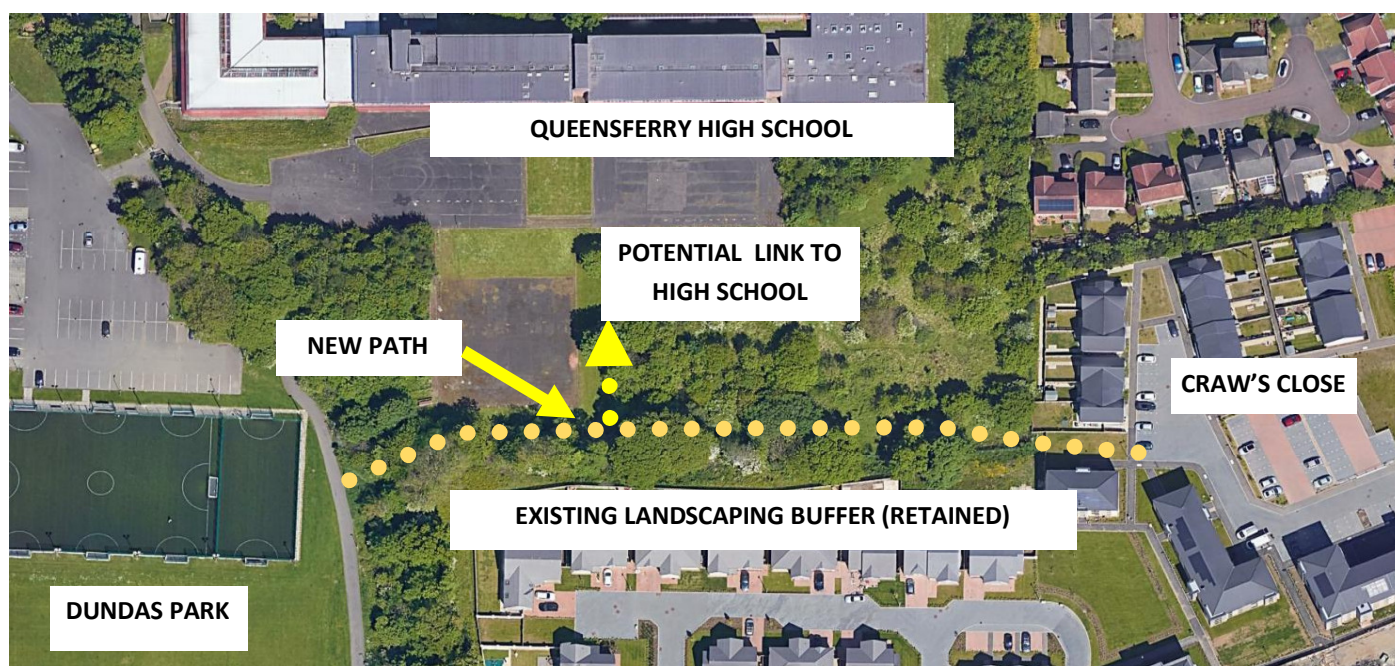
QUEENSFERRY HIGH SCHOOL LINK

Atkins are working with the Council team to explore improvements to the active travel network in Queensferry. As part of the early stages of this we are developing proposals for the construction of a new link to the south of Queensferry High School.

The proposed link would connect the existing paths in Dundas Park through to the new housing at Craw's Close. The link will be a shared use path, able to be used by all those walking, wheeling and cycling to access Dundas Park, local schools and provide a new connection towards Dalmeny Station.

We are keen to hear from the local community about the potential delivery of this link and we would welcome any comments or feedback that you have.

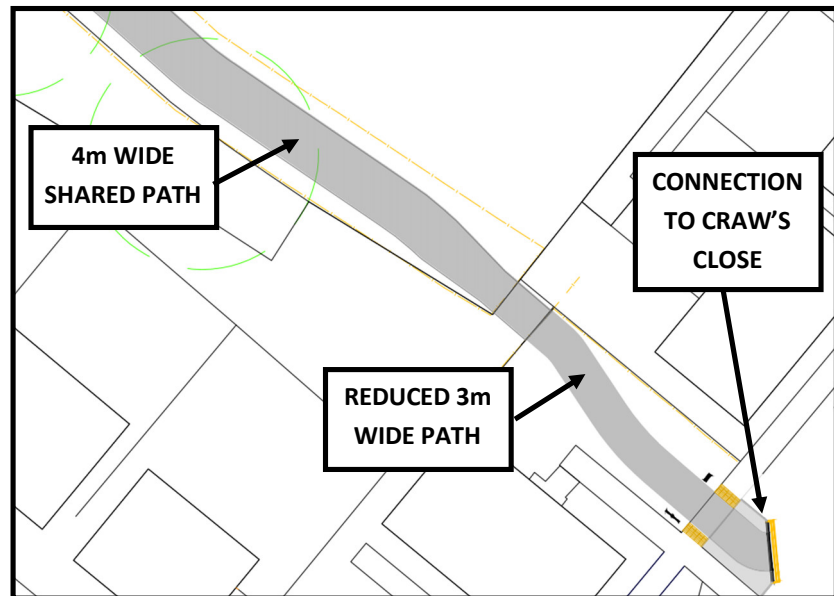
Further information on the project is provided overleaf and an outline location plan provided below.



The project is looking to create a new 4m wide shared use surfaced path which, via a new ramp connection, will link the housing at Craw's Close to Dundas Park, providing an improved connection towards Queensferry High School.

The link will be designed to avoid any impact on the mature trees which line the route, with root protection measures incorporated into the design. The final scheme will also include appropriate lighting along its length.

The path is to be provided as a 4m wide shared use path but there is a need to narrow this at the eastern end where it connects through to Craw's Close. As shown in the sketch to the right the path would reduce in width and then continue at 3 m width to connect to the existing road at Crows Close by way of a new dropped kerb provision.
