Opening of Granton Station Square marks first major milestone of <u>£1.3bn Granton Waterfront regeneration</u>



Locals in north Edinburgh being invited to celebrate the opening of Granton Station Square this Saturday (11 March 2023) will also be given a sneak peek of the magnificently refurbished Edwardian Granton Station building. Completion of the square and station building is the first major milestone of <u>the City of Edinburgh Council's</u> wider £1.3bn regeneration of Granton Waterfront. All are invited to attend the free <u>community event</u>.

The site had lain vacant for years before it was bought over by the Council in 2018. The £4.75m restoration of the building, together with the development of the square, were

partly funded through the Scottish Government's Regeneration Capital Grant Fund and Town Centre Fund.

The name for the square was chosen following an online consultation with local residents.

The station building will be managed by social enterprise charity Wasps Studios, who work across Edinburgh and Scotland, to provide affordable workspace for artists and the creative industries. Wasps will be taking on the building shortly to start their internal fit out.

When opened the charity will be providing space to support around 40 jobs, as well as helping around 100 people each year with creative business development opportunities. Alongside this they will deliver a heritage programme for local people and railway enthusiasts on the unique history of the location as well as providing exhibition space to showcase local talent. They'll also host workshops and a series of outdoor and online events for locals, with the potential to attract thousands of visitors to the area.

The newly created public square in front of the building will be host to events and local community activity throughout the year. Council leader Cammy Day will cut the ribbon to open this fantastic and innovative new public space and everyone attending will also have the opportunity to take a guided tour of the newly refurbished historic Granton Station building ahead of it officially opening later this year.

Family fun will be part of the celebrations from 11am to 2pm on the day where visitors will meet some local crafters, makers and organisations at the market stalls and will be able to join in with play and arts activities on the lawn. There will also be performances from Edinburgh College students and the Newhaven Community Choir.

Local S3 pupils from Craigroyston Community High School have also been busy creating beautiful artwork symbolising the area with local artist Shona Hardie to be displayed from this weekend down Waterfront Broadway for everyone to see as they make their way to the event. A history exhibition will also be displayed on the square's two new art benches, which going forward, will provide free exhibition space year-round. Granton Waterfront will partner with cultural organisations to curate a changing programme of work inspired by and/or created by local artists and residents on the benches. The project was launched in March 2023 with a themed exhibition 'Past, Present, Future' to showcase historic and current-day images of key heritage assets within the area.



Today (March 3), the next phase of the Edinburgh Community Climate Fund (ECCF) is getting underway.

The City of Edinburgh Council has set up the £100,000 fund to help communities to develop and choose projects aimed at making Edinburgh a greener city.

Community, voluntary and non-profit organisations from across the city have submitted over 50 proposals for up to £20,000 each. <u>These community projects</u> have diverse aims including to reduce household carbon emissions, encourage dialogue about climate change and support the city's net zero effort.

We need your help to decide what gets funded by voting for your favourite ideas.

You have a total of 5 votes to use and can only vote once for a project. Please <u>consider all the projects</u> before making your final decision.

Voting is simple and easy. For adults, you can vote by using <u>myaccount</u>. This is a secure way to access a range of Scottish public services online using just one username and password. We have <u>guidance on</u> <u>registering on our website</u>.

For those under 18 wishing to vote this can be done through <u>Young Scot</u> using your Young Scot NEC number. School libraries will be offering supported voting.

Supported voting will also be available at all public libraries across the city. Please visit <u>your local library</u> for more information and to get help to vote for your favourite chosen projects.


Wildlife zone - curlew breeding season

You'll see posters from Curlew Action around the farm about curlew breeding season. Curlews are ground nesting birds, and prefer open areas away from trees. We are hoping they will use the fenced off zone for their nests - we won't be cutting grass in there while there could be chicks, and continue to ask walkers to avoid those fields. Fingers crossed for this breeding season, and please let us know of any sightings.

Edinburgh Community Climate Fund - Vote for the Heart



HONC has applied for funding from Edinburgh Community Climate Fund. Over 50 projects have been submitted and those with the most votes will be awarded grants until the fund of £100,000 is exhausted. Voting is open to all Edinburgh residents over the age of eight,

until 12th March. The Heart's proposal is the development of a teaching kitchen which will complement the partnership work we are already doing with Homestart in the development of a community garden within the curtilage of The Heart, and with Mwamba in our 'pots of herbs' project. Other organisations and groups keen to work with us in developing and using the facility include Edinburgh Community Food, Leith Pantry and the Ukrainian community. We also have close links to Friends of Victoria Park and Victoria Allotments who would provide a seasonal input of fruit and vegetables to the kitchen for community use.

Newhaven Community Consultation

Are you interested in local history and heritage? If so, we would encourage you to join Museums & Galleries Edinburgh (MGE) for a discussion of how they can best support heritage within the Newhaven community. The last community consultation took place in 2010 and in the intervening years, the Wee Museum at Victoria Primary School formed a focus for MGE's support of local heritage. The consultation is to develop a coherent way forward for MGE to find a solution that meets the needs of the different communities and organisations in the area.

Drylaw Telford Community Organisation SCIO wishes to appoint a Centre Development Co-ordinator to develop the work of Drylaw Neighbourhood Centre in the local community.

Background

You will have a deep understanding and passion for the development and growth of Drylaw Neighbourhood Centre and our community, bringing energy and passion to the role.

You are a problem solver whose attention to detail is as strong as your appreciation of the bigger picture. With great communication skills you will be able to interact with a variety of stakeholders whilst continually prioritising centre needs with wider organisational objectives.

The Centre currently hosts a wide variety of activities, and we strive to support the health and wellbeing of all members of our community regardless of race, gender, ability, background, beliefs or orientation. The Drylaw Telford Community Organisation Management Committee is keen to continue development and support of the community-based activities within the Centre's facilities.

The Centre is based in a purpose-built building in extensive grounds and has a well-appointed kitchen, a small and medium sized meeting room, a creche area as well as a large hall. The post holder will advise the Management Committee and work with existing stakeholders, service providers and the community to develop current and new projects which will benefit the locality and, most importantly, galvanise a sense of joint purpose and shared community.

Responsibilities

The Centre Development Co-ordinator will be expected to

- 1. Familiarise themselves with groups and activities currently taking place in the Centre and offer support to groups/group leaders as required and where appropriate.
- 2. Line manage some staff and volunteers
- 3. Develop local groups, events, and activities which further the Centre's vision and work alongside the Management Committee to agree classes and events operating in the building.
- 4. Work collaboratively with the management committee and in partnership with Centre based employees with the aim of promoting the smooth running of the Centre's activities. Provide key-holding responsibility periodically (subject to Management Committee approval)
- 5. Work with the Management Committee to identify/deliver fundraising activities, such as researching potential sponsors and funders, developing fundraising events, and writing proposals to potential sources of funds.
- 6. Develop outreach work to deliver our inclusive goals and engagement remits through networking and open dialogue across and between current centre users, local neighbourhood and the wider diverse communities.
- 7. Develop use of the building's spaces to attract commercial lets, to raise the profile of the Centre and create both income and resources to support community projects.
- 8. Represent the Centre at local events to promote the Centre's contribution to the locality.

Contractual arrangements

- This is an initial 2 year contract focussing on specific project goals.
- The hours are 28 per week, salary £29500. Working pattern to be agreed between the committee and the successful candidate(s). Working-time should be appropriately logged.
- Applicants should be educated to degree-level or equivalent in a professional discipline.
- The post-holder will be directly responsible to the Management Committee Chair (or other named Committee member). A regular report should be provided to the monthly Management Committee. Any short period of leave must be arranged and agreed in advance.
- Office facilities will be provided in the Centre.
- The SCIO is an equal opportunity employer and is guided by the City of Edinburgh Equality and Diversity Framework.

The successful candidate must have

- 1. Demonstrable experience of working in partnership settings with a wide range of stakeholders including but not limited to; Community Councils, Local Community Planning Partnerships, Tenants and Residents organisations, Community Centre Management Committees, statutory agencies and voluntary sector partners.
- 2. Demonstrable experience in the development and leading of multi-agency groups in a partnership setting with particular emphasis on collaboration, consistency, coordination, and public engagement.
- 3. Demonstrable experience in community engagement and capacity building.
- 4. Demonstrable experience in supporting/enabling community involvement/influence, in the decision-making processes associated with the development of Centre based and community development programmes.
- 5. Demonstrated ability to communicate, influence and negotiate effectively at all levels whilst maintaining effective relationships with a diverse range of people and organisations.

- 6. Excellent problem-solving skills including interpretation of policy and guidance in a range of situations and the ability to provide creative solutions to problems that may arise with a range of partners, stakeholders, and funders.
- 7. Ability to work flexible hours including occasional weekend work.

Qualifications and training

Qualified to degree level or equivalent in a relevant professional discipline. In exceptional cases this requirement may be satisfied through relevant experience and demonstrated competence.
